To amend title 18, United States Code, with respect to civil forfeitures relating to certain seized animals.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Help Extract Animals
- 5 from Red Tape Act of 2017" or the "HEART Act of
- 6 2017".
- 7 SEC. 2. REDUCED NOTICE PERIOD.
- 8 (a) Notice Timing for Cases of Animal Sei-
- 9 ZURE.—Section 983(a)(1)(A) of title 18, United States

1	Code, is amended by adding at the end the following new
2	clause:
3	"(vi) With respect to an animal seized
4	under section 26 of the Animal Welfare
5	Act or under section 1955 of this title,
6	clauses (i), (ii), (iii), and (v), shall be ap-
7	plied by substituting '30-days' for '60-
8	days'.''.
9	(b) Notice Procedures for Cases of Animal
10	SEIZURE.—Section 983(a)(1) of title 18, United States
11	Code, as amended by this Act, is amended—
12	(1) in subparagraph (B) by inserting "and with
13	respect to an animal seized under section 26 of the
14	Animal Welfare Act or section 1955 of this title,
15	that the delay is warranted in light of the criteria
16	in subparagraph (G)" after "if the official deter-
17	mines that the conditions in subparagraph (D) are
18	present,";
19	(2) in subparagraph (C) by inserting "and with
20	respect to an animal seized under section 26 of the
21	Animal Welfare Act or section 1955 of this title,
22	that the delay is warranted in light of the criteria
23	in subparagraph (G)" after "that the conditions in
24	subparagraph (D) are present,"; and

1	(3) by adding after subparagraph (F), the fol-

16	SEC. 3. SEIZURES OF ANIMALS.
17	(a) Payment for Certain Costs.—Section
18	524(c)(1) of title 28, United States Code, is amended by
19	adding after subparagraph (I), the following:
20	"(J) payment for the transportation, shel-
21	ter, care, veterinary services, and where appro-
22	priate, humane euthanasia of an animal seized
23	under section 26 of the Animal Welfare Act or
24	under section 1955 of title 18.".

1	(b) Reimbursement and Proportionality.—Sec-
2	tion 983(h) of title 18, United States Code, is amended
3	by adding at the end, the following:
4	"(4) In any civil forfeiture proceeding in which
5	the Government prevails, the court shall require the
6	claimant, to reimburse the United States for any ac-
7	tual and reasonable costs to the government for the
8	transportation, shelter, care, veterinary services, or
9	where appropriate, humane euthanasia of an animal
10	that was the subject of the proceeding. The reim-
11	bursement shall be credited to the agency or fund
12	that was used to pay the costs being reimbursed.
13	"(5) In any civil forfeiture proceeding in which
14	an animal is subject of the proceeding, the court
15	may reduce the size of a reimbursement based on
16	any of the following factors:
17	"(A) The seriousness of the offense.
18	"(B) The culpability of the claimant.
19	"(C) The claimant's prior record.
20	"(D) The claimant's financial condition
21	and need to support a family.
22	"(E) The purpose of the forfeiture statute
23	in question.".
