Dear Majority Leader McConnell, Minority Leader Schumer, Speaker Pelosi, and Minority Leader McCarthy:

As you continue to negotiate the next bill to address the COVID-19 pandemic, we urge you to ensure that the final legislation provides critical protections and support for immigrants and their families. Since the passage of the CARES Act (P.L.116-136), it's even more clear that immigrants are helping our nation survive. We urge you to follow the roadmap created by the Coronavirus Immigrant Families Protection Act (H.R.6437) to truly meet the needs of immigrant families at this critical moment, and we thank leadership in the House for the passage of the Heroes Act (H.R. 6800), which includes many vital immigration provisions.

Simply put, immigrants are essential. While these workers have kept the nation fed and cared for, many make low wages and lack health insurance at a time when health care is more important than ever. And in addition to essential work under difficult working conditions, immigrant communities and communities of color have been disproportionately affected by the spread and detrimental health impacts of COVID-19.

With unemployment rates over 11 percent -- higher than they were during the Great Recession -- and with more than 1 in 6 households with children experiencing hunger, the need for financial support is urgent. The CARES Act excluded from stimulus payments any family that had an Individual Tax Identification Number (ITIN) taxpayer. The exclusion of immigrant families from economic stimulus payments is deeply unjust and resulted in millions of U.S. citizen spouses and children being denied the relief they desperately need. All families including those with Individual Tax Identification Number (ITIN) taxpayers must be eligible for financial assistance.

As a relief bill is negotiated, we also urge you to support the availability of COVID-19 testing, treatment, and vaccines, and to ensure that everyone has adequate access to these health care services, regardless of immigration status. Congress expanded COVID-19 testing through Medicaid for the uninsured in prior coronavirus relief legislation. We also ask that in any subsequent coronavirus relief legislation, you ensure that all low-income communities, including immigrants, can access Medicaid-funded COVID-19-related medical care such as treatment and

vaccines, alongside coverage for testing. In addition, many essential workers, including healthcare workers, are DACA or TPS holders. These frontline workers who are risking their lives to save others must be able to maintain their work authorization and access key coronavirus relief measures. Since the enactment of the CARES Act and the House passage of the Heroes Act, the Department of Homeland Security has taken steps to dismantle DACA, even after the U.S. Supreme Court ordered the agency to reinstate the program in June. The litigation impacting the fate of many TPS recipients also hangs in the balance with a federal court decision expected soon. No one should have to worry about losing their immigration status, especially in the middle of a pandemic.

Finally, immigration enforcement during the pandemic, including the continued use of detention and new immigration raids and arrests, serves only to place immigrants, their families, and communities at increased risk of COVID-19. As months have passed during this pandemic, the rapid spread of COVID-19 in custodial settings and the risk to those in detention has become clear. Congress should require U.S. Immigration & Customs Enforcement (ICE) to prioritize detainees for release. Congress must also ensure that immigration enforcement is not funded by any coronavirus relief package and must maintain safeguards to prevent the administration from transferring or reprogramming funds related to COVID-19 for the purposes of immigration enforcement.

We appreciate your continued leadership in these negotiations and urge you to continue fighting for immigrant families, so they have what they need to survive this pandemic. Thank you for your attention to this important matter.
