### A BILL

- To permit the Smithsonian National Museum of the American Latino and the Smithsonian American Women's History Museum to be located within the Reserve of the National Mall, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Smithsonian History5 of American Women and Latino Act" or the "SHAWL6 Act".

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# 1SEC. 2. SITE OF SMITHSONIAN NATIONAL MUSEUM OF THE2AMERICAN LATINO.

3 (a) Authorizing Site Within Reserve of Na4 Tional Mall.—

5 (1) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other
6 provision of law or regulation, including section
7 8908(c) of title 40, United States Code, the Smith8 sonian National Museum of the American Latino
9 may be located within the Reserve (as defined in sec10 tion 8902(a) of title 40, United States Code).

(2) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—Section
201(g)(4) of division T of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 (20 U.S.C. 80u(g)(4)) is amended by striking ", except that" and all that follows
and inserting a period.

(b) USE OF SITE UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF ANOTHER FEDERAL AGENCY.—Section 201(g)(2) of division
T of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 (20
U.S.C. 80u(g)(2) is amended to read as follows:

20 "(2) SITE UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF AN21 OTHER FEDERAL AGENCY.—

"(A) NOTIFICATION TO OTHER AGENCY OR
ENTITY.—The Board of Regents shall not designate a site for the Museum that is under the
administrative jurisdiction of another Federal

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agency or entity without first notifying the head of the Federal agency or entity.

"(B) NOTIFICATION TO COMMITTEES.— 3 4 Once notified under subparagraph (A), the head of the Federal agency or entity shall promptly 5 6 submit written notification to the Chair and 7 ranking minority members of the Committee on 8 Rules and Administration, the Committee on 9 Appropriations, and the Committee on Energy 10 and Natural Resources of the Senate, and the 11 Committee on House Administration, the Com-12 mittee on Natural Resources, the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, and the 13 14 Committee on Appropriations of the House of 15 Representatives, stating that the Federal agen-16 cy or entity was notified by the Board of Re-17 gents that a site under its jurisdiction was des-18 ignated and that a transfer will be initiated as 19 soon as practicable.

"(C) TRANSFER.—As soon as practicable
after the date on which the individuals described in subparagraph (B) receive the written
notification described in such subparagraph, the
head of the Federal agency or entity shall
transfer to the Smithsonian Institution its ad-

1	ministrative jurisdiction over the land or struc-
2	ture that has been designated as the site for the
3	Museum.".
4	(c) Ensuring Diversity of Political View-
5	POINTS AND AUTHENTIC EXPERIENCES.—Section
6	201(d)(2)(D) of division T of the Consolidated Appropria-
7	tions Act, 2021 (20 U.S.C. $80u(d)(2)(D)$ ) is amended to
8	read as follows:
9	"(D) Ensuring diversity of political
10	VIEWPOINTS AND AUTHENTIC EXPERIENCES.—
11	"(i) IN GENERAL.—The Board of
12	Trustees shall ensure that the exhibits and
13	programs of the Museum accurately and
14	comprehensively represent the varied cul-
15	tures, histories, events, and values of His-
16	panic or Latino communities.
17	"(ii) Specific requirements.—In
18	carrying out its duties, the Board of Trust-
19	ees shall ensure that it seeks and utilizes
20	to its maximum ability guidance from a
21	broad array of knowledgeable and re-
22	spected sources reflecting the diversity of
23	the political viewpoints and authentic expe-
24	riences held by Hispanics or Latinos in the
25	United States, and shall seek such guid-

1	ance for both the creation and substantial
2	revision of exhibits and programs.
3	"(iii) Definitions.—In this subpara-
4	graph—
5	"(I) the term 'broad array'
6	means a range of experts and publica-
7	tions that represent the broad spec-
8	trum of Hispanic or Latino commu-
9	nities, to include varied viewpoints,
10	political ideologies, cultures, and lived
11	experiences in the United States; and
12	"(II) the term 'knowledgeable
13	and respected source' means an indi-
14	vidual who has gained through edu-
15	cation, publication, or witnessing an
16	important or historical event, the abil-
17	ity to advise on at least one unique
18	viewpoint or experience of a particular
19	Hispanic or Latino community, and
20	whose knowledge has been relied upon
21	by a notable segment of that commu-
22	nity for education, heritage preserva-
23	tion, or historical purposes, and in-
24	cludes the work of such an individual

which reflects such ability and knowl edge.".

3 (d) REPORTS TO CONGRESS.—Not later than 120 4 days after the date of enactment of this Act and every 5 2 years thereafter, the Secretary of the Smithsonian shall submit to the Committee on Natural Resources of the 6 7 House of Representatives, the Committee on Energy and 8 Natural Resources of the Senate, the Committee on House 9 Administration of the House of Representatives, the Com-10 mittee on Rules and Administration of the Senate, the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure of the 11 12 House of Representatives, the Committee on Appropria-13 tions of the House of Representatives, and the Committee on Appropriations of the Senate, a report on actions taken 14 15 by the Director of the Smithsonian National Museum of the American Latino Museum and the Board of Trustees 16 17 of the Museum to comply with the requirements of the amendments made by subsection (c), including a descrip-18 19 tion of actions taken with respect to substantial revisions 20 of current exhibits and programs as well the planning of 21 future exhibits and programs.

(e) EFFECTIVE DATE.—This section and the amendments made by this section shall take effect as if included
in the enactment of section 201 of division T of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 (20 U.S.C. 80u).

3 (a) Authorizing Site Within Reserve of Na4 Tional Mall.—

5 (1) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other
6 provision of law or regulation, including section
7 8908(c) of title 40, United States Code, the Smith8 sonian American Women's History Museum may be
9 located within the Reserve (as defined in section
10 8902(a) of title 40, United States Code).

(2) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—Section
107(d) of division T of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 (20 U.S.C. 80t–5(d)) is amended by
striking ", except that" and all that follows and inserting a period.

(b) USE OF SITE UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF ANOTHER FEDERAL AGENCY.—Section 107(b) of division T
of the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 (20 U.S.C.
80t-5(b) is amended to read as follows:

20 "(b) SITE UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF ANOTHER21 FEDERAL AGENCY.—

"(1) NOTIFICATION TO OTHER AGENCY OR ENTITY.—The Board of Regents shall not designate a
site for the Museum that is under the administrative
jurisdiction of another Federal agency or entity

without first notifying the head of the Federal agen cy or entity.

3 "(2) NOTIFICATION TO COMMITTEES.—Once 4 notified under paragraph (1), the head of the Fed-5 eral agency or entity shall promptly submit written 6 notification to the Chair and ranking minority mem-7 bers of the Committee on Rules and Administration, 8 the Committee on Appropriations, and the Com-9 mittee on Energy and Natural Resources of the Sen-10 ate, and the Committee on House Administration, 11 the Committee on Natural Resources, the Committee 12 on Transportation and Infrastructure, and the Com-13 mittee on Appropriations of the House of Represent-14 atives, stating that the Federal agency or entity was 15 notified by the Board of Regents that a site under 16 its jurisdiction was designated and that a transfer 17 will be initiated as soon as practicable.

18 "(3) TRANSFER.—As soon as practicable after 19 the date on which the individuals described in para-20 graph (2) receive the written notification described 21 in such subparagraph, the head of the Federal agen-22 cy or entity shall transfer to the Smithsonian Insti-23 tution its administrative jurisdiction over the land or 24 structure that has been designated as the site for 25 the Museum.".

(c) ENSURING DIVERSITY OF POLITICAL VIEW POINTS AND AUTHENTIC EXPERIENCES.—Section
 104(b)(4) of division T of the Consolidated Appropriations
 Act, 2021 (20 U.S.C. 80t-2(b)(4) is amended to read as
 follows:

6 "(4) ENSURING DIVERSITY OF POLITICAL VIEW7 POINTS AND AUTHENTIC EXPERIENCES.—

8 "(A) IN GENERAL.—The Council shall en-9 sure that the exhibits and programs of the Mu-10 seum accurately and comprehensively represent 11 the varied cultures, histories, events, and values 12 held by women in the United States.

13 "(B) SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS.—In car-14 rving out its duties, the Council shall ensure 15 that it seeks and utilizes to its maximum ability guidance from a broad array of knowledgeable 16 17 and respected sources reflecting the diversity of 18 the political viewpoints and authentic experi-19 ences held by women in the United States, and 20 shall seek such guidance for both the creation 21 and substantial revision of exhibits and pro-22 grams.

23 "(D) DEFINITIONS.—In this subpara24 graph—

1	"(i) the term 'broad array' means a
2	range of experts and publications that rep-
3	resent the broad spectrum of communities
4	of women, to include varied viewpoints, po-
5	litical ideologies, cultures, and lived experi-
6	ences in the United States; and
7	"(ii) the term 'knowledgeable and re-
8	spected source' means an individual who
9	has gained through education, publication,
10	or witnessing an important or historical
11	event, the ability to advise on at least one
12	unique viewpoint or experience of a par-
13	ticular community of women in the United
14	States, and whose knowledge has been re-
15	lied upon by a notable segment of that
16	community for education, heritage preser-
17	vation, or historical purposes, and includes
18	the work of such an individual which re-
19	flects such ability and knowledge.".
20	(d) REPORTS TO CONGRESS.—Not later than 120
21	days after the date of enactment of this Act and every
22	2 years thereafter, the Secretary of the Smithsonian shall

House of Representatives, the Committee on Energy and

25 Natural Resources of the Senate, the Committee on House

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Administration of the House of Representatives, the Com-1 2 mittee on Rules and Administration of the Senate, the 3 Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure of the 4 House of Representatives, the Committee on Appropria-5 tions of the House of Representatives, and the Committee on Appropriations of the Senate, a report on actions taken 6 7 by the Director of the Smithsonian American Women's 8 History Museum and the Council of the Museum to com-9 ply with the requirements of the amendments made by subsection (c), including a description of actions taken 10 11 with respect to substantial revisions of current exhibits 12 and programs as well the planning of future exhibits and 13 programs.

in the enactment of title I of division T of the Consolidated
Appropriations Act, 2021 (20 U.S.C. 80t et seq.).
