RESOLUTION

Of inquiry requesting the President and directing the Secretary of Health and Human Services to transmit, respectively, certain documents to the House of Representatives relating to the “Defend the Spend” freeze on child care payments to all States, Tribes, and Territories.

1 *Resolved*, That the President of the United States is
2 requested, and the Secretary of Health and Human Serv-
3 ices is directed, to transmit, to the extent that such docu-
4 ments are in the possession of the President or the Sec-
5 retary, to the House of Representatives, not later than 14
6 days after the date of adoption of this resolution, copies

1 of any document, audit trail, record, audio recording,
2 memorandum, call log, correspondence (electronic or oth-
3 erwise), written agreements, report, study, contract, staff-
4 ing assignment, legal analysis or other communication in
5 their possession, or any portion of any document, record,
6 audit trail, audio recording, memorandum, call log, con-
7 tract, staffing assignment, legal analysis, correspondence
8 (electronic or otherwise), or other communication, that re-
9 fers or relates to the following:

10 (1) The tweet by Health and Human Services
11 (HHS) Deputy Secretary Jim O’Neill on December
12 30, 2025, freezing all Administration for Children
13 and Families (ACF) payments and reinstating
14 “Defend the Spend” procedures.

15 (2) Drawdown of Child Care Entitlement to
16 States (CCES) allocations authorized under section
17 418 of the Social Security Act via the Payment
18 Management System (PMS) any time after Decem-
19 ber 30, 2025, by any State, Territory, or Tribal
20 CCES grantee.

21 (3) Payment management system delays and
22 procedure for addressing funding delays and com-
23 plaints after April 15, 2025, related to entitlement
24 funding authorized under title IV or subtitle A of
25 title XX of the Social Security Act.

1 (4) HHS, ACF, and Executive Office of the
2 President social media posts alleging child care
3 fraud and resulting threats to, and harassment of,
4 individual child care providers after December 30,
5 2025.

6 (5) Warning letters, referrals to the Office of
7 the Inspector General, or other disciplinary actions
8 regarding alleged funding misuse by any grantee
9 who has received a payment funded in whole or in
10 part under title IV of the Social Security Act be-
11 tween January 20, 2025, and December 1, 2025.

12 (6) Communication with grantees regarding the
13 submission of additional data in order to draw down
14 funds provided in whole or in part under title IV of
15 the Social Security Act and the storage, use, and
16 sharing of such data within and outside of HHS
17 after April 15, 2025.

18 (7) Payments to contractors or consultants re-
19 lated to “Defend the Spend” requirements, proce-
20 dures, or implementation, which affect funds pro-
21 vided under title IV of the Social Security Act.

22 (8) Legal opinions regarding the designation as
23 “proprietary”, nonpublic, or unavailable to congres-
24 sional requesters of such information related to con-
25 tracting, spending of legally authorized funding, re-

1 ferrals to the Office of the Inspector General, staff-
2 ing assignments, or procedures related to funding
3 authorized under title IV or subtitle A of title XX
4 of the Social Security Act.

5 (9) Contracts, staffing assignments, and in-
6 structions to contractors and any HHS staff (wheth-
7 er based in the District of Columbia or regionally)
8 regarding the “Defend the Spend” criteria and proc-
9 ess for State, Tribal, or Territorial entitlements
10 under subtitle A of title IV of the Social Security
11 Act.

12 (10) Contracts with States, Tribes, and Terri-
13 tories governing any payment management system
14 operative in 2025 and 2026 and used to provide
15 grantee access to entitlement funding provided
16 under title IV of the Social Security Act.

17 (11) Meetings, discussions, or other actions in-
18 volving the HHS Office of the General Counsel or
19 outside legal advisors regarding the use of a pay-
20 ment management system by grantees or efforts to
21 provide, delay, or prevent access to entitlement fund-
22 ing, including such funding authorized under title IV
23 or subtitle A of title XX of the Social Security Act,
24 after January 20, 2025.
